



- Reach out via email to schedule a chat




Dean of Students



What for?

- Typically, one dean will be assigned to a large number of students (could even be the entire class!)
- Serve you in conjunction with your professors and advisors
- Liaisons between students and faculties
- Go to them if you feel uncomfortable communicating with your professors, for instance, an extension on an assignment
- Also serve as advisors to student organizations
